Current Work

- **Currently providing remote classes at Freeman House, a St Vincent de Paul Residential Alcohol & Drug Recovery and Learning centre in Armidale, NSW** (commenced in 2015). The classes form part of four evidence-based programs in Mindfulness, Health & Nutrition, Anger Management and a Moving Forward class (Addiction Recovery/Prevention). All classes are designed, continuously developed and facilitated by Hartmut based on evidence-based research, client feedback, engagement and class attendance. During the Covid-19 Lockdown commencing in April 2020, classes have been recorded and published online as residents have courageously and kindly given permission for [these class recordings](#) to be shared online.
- Working as **Nutrition Medicine Clinician since 2009** and setup own clinic in 2010. Provide consultations to children and adults. See [Details of Consultations](#) .
- In 2015 founded **Toxtest - a collaborative project** with the Environmental Analysis Laboratory at Southern Cross University in Lismore, NSW. The Laboratory performs water, soil, dust, food and hair tests. Toxtest visualises people's results in innovative ways and presents them de-identified online. See <https://www.toxtest.com.au/> Hartmut liaises with the laboratory, processes results, is responsible for all marketing, programing, design, research, writing and final consultations with clients. Work is steadily increasing as innovative ways are explored that raise public and individual awareness of the impacts on human, animal and environmental health as a result of exposures to toxic chemicals.

- **In 2014 founded Toxno.** Toxno is a database and website project. There are 25,000 substance profiles on Toxno, all searchable and many show health related information. There are lists of chemicals grouped into meaningful categories like – substances known to cause cancer or all authorised pesticides in Australia and much more. In 2016 an investigative writing and research project aimed at identifying potential harm to human and environmental health from heavy metals, pesticides and other upcoming chemicals like PFAS was commenced. Articles are currently written and updated that help inform client's results and possible exposure pathways from the toxicology testing on Toxtest.
- In May 2014 was engaged by the **Cancer Council NSW** to present a 6-part program entitled ENRICH that helps inform healthy eating and nutrition understanding for cancer survivors and their helpers. Engagement is ongoing but has been put on hold due to the Covid-19 virus pandemic in 2020.

Previous work

Worked as "train the trainer" and a facilitator of the **National HEAL™ Program** and the **Diabetes Council of Australia's** BEAT IT program from 2012 -2014 in Guyra and Tingha, NSW.

Contracted by the Guyra Shire Council to develop a database software solution designed to help deliver their evaluation requirements for the Australian Government's Healthy Communities Initiative (HCI). Was also asked to be on the **steering committee** that reports to the Council and **Department of Health and Ageing (DOHA)**. This whole project ended on the 30th May 2014.

Trained in and worked as **Allied health professional** at a health clinic (MetCentre) on Mt Tamborine, QLD in fields of **body work and trigger point therapy** from 2001-2009 while concurrently studying Nutrition Medicine from 2006-2010.

Collaborated with **Apple computer** in very successful business. Hartmut founded and was CEO of MacCentral from 1989-2000. Worked in the areas of marketing, sales, **programing and consultancy**.

Trained and worked as Chef under two extraordinary owner Chefs at Blooms Restaurant in Perth from 1981-1988. Developed expertise in food preparation, food hygiene and creating nutritious and delicious meals quickly within budget using only fresh whole-foods.
